The Aplington City Council met in regular session on January 11, 2023. Jason Mehmen, Mayor, called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council members present: Schipper, Meyer, Lage, Uhlenhopp, and Jacobs.

A motion by Lage, seconded by Meyer, to approve the consent agenda, which includes the agenda, the financial report ending December 2022, and a list of claims as presented, carried unanimously.

Mayor Jason Mehmen made the following appointments for 2023:

Mayor ProTem – Alan Meyer; Chief of Police – Matt Lind; Library Board – Paul Hosch, Marilyn Klooster, Lee Harken, Casey Sents, Sally Nevenhoven; Cemetery Board – LaVerne Eilers, Byron Johnson, Diane Meyer, Jim Ridder, Alan Meyer, with the City Clerk to maintain records; Finance Committee – Uhlenhopp, Schipper, Meyer; Utilities – Jacobs, Uhlenhopp Lage; Streets – Schipper, Lage, Meyer; Butler County Solid Waste Commission – Deb Prier.

A motion by Meyer, seconded by Lage, to appoint Deb Prier as City Clerk and Dave Kuehner as the City Attorney, carried unanimously.

Jeff Ridder, Public Works Director reported on the repairs done on the dump truck. He also reported that the building for Dumont Telephone will be set in place on Tuesday, January 17.

Chief Lind reported on the police department's activity.

Alexis Karsjens reported on the activities at the Library.

Deb Prier reported that two students have begun taking the EMT classes for the Ambulance Department.

Holly Harken gave a report on the pool project and fundraising efforts.

A motion by Jacobs, seconded by Uhlenhopp, to approve One Design & Engineering, LLC for the pool concept design service, carried unanimously.

The title opinion for the purchase of Lots One and Two in block Four, Aplington, Iowa was reviewed and accepted.

A motion by Meyer, seconded by Uhlenhopp to set February 15 for the public hearing on the Maximum Levy for Fiscal Year budget 2024, carried unanimously. A motion was made by Lage and seconded by Jacobs to have a budget workshop on February 15, carried unanimously.

A motion by Lage, seconded by Schipper, to approve the 1st reading of Ordinance 218-23 amending Chapter 56 Urban chickens, Section 56.03, 56.05, 56.09, 56.11, carried with a roll call vote of all ayes. A motion by Lage, seconded by Schipper, to waive the 2nd and 3rd readings of Ordinance 218-23, carried with a roll call vote of all ayes.

A motion by Meyer, seconded by Uhlenhopp, to approve the 1st reading of Ordinance 219-23 amending Section 69.10 Snow and Ice Removal, carried with a roll call vote of all ayes. A motion by Schipper, seconded by Jacobs, to waive the 2nd and 3rd readings of Ordinance 219-23, carried with a roll call vote of all ayes.

Discussion was held on Ordinance 220-23 Amending Section 70.03 Parking Violations. The Council previously approved a \$25.00 increase for snow route parking violations over 30 days. The wording in Ordinance 220-23 omitted this. The amended ordinance will be re-introduced at the February 15 meeting.

A motion by Meyer, seconded by Lage, to approve Ordinance 221-23 Amending Section 106.08 Collection Fees for Solid Waste, carried with a roll call vote of all ayes. A motion by Jacobs, seconded by Uhlenhopp, to waive the 2nd and 3rd

readings of Ordinance 221-23, carried with a roll call vote of all ayes.

A motion by Jacobs, seconded by Uhlenhopp, to approve the Eclipse News-Review as the official newspaper of the City of Aplington for 2023, carried unanimously. Due to a conflict, the regular City Council meeting for February will be changed. A motion by Jacobs, seconded by Meyer, to change the regular February 2023 meeting to Wednesday, February 15 at 6 p.m., carried unanimously.

In other business the Council discussed deceased trees and reviewing ordinances concerning trees in the parking. Council member Lage will look into applying for a DNR grant for replacing trees.

There being no further business, a motion by Meyer, seconded by Lage, to adjourn, carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 7:18 p.m.

Council members present: Abkes, Bruns, Cuvelier, Goodrich, and Johnson. Mayor Mike Timmer called the meeting to order and led those in attendance in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Timmer led those in attendance in a moment of silence in memory of Vern Ingalls who served on the Planning & Zoning Board for over 49 years and also served the community in many ways as a businessman and community volunteer.

The Public Works Department provided information on work to be done soon at the water plant and additional Ash trees that need to be removed in the near future.

Review as the official newspaper of the City of Parkersburg. Upon vote, all ayes.

There was a motion by Goodrich, seconded by Bruns to approve the appointment of Rus Boersma: Fire Chief. Upon vote, all ayes.

There was a motion by Goodrich, seconded by Cuvelier to approve the appointment of Leon Schwedtfeger: Ambulance Chief. Upon vote, all ayes. There was a motion by Johnson, seconded by Abkes to approve the appointment of Brian Meester: Ambulance Driver. Upon vote, all ayes.

There was a motion by Goodrich, seconded by Cuvelier to approve the final pay estimate for the Grant St/Johnson Street watermain project. Upon vote, all ayes.

There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Johnson to approve the final acceptance of the Grant

Street/Johnson Street watermain project. Upon vote, all ayes. Special recognition was given to those who worked to bring this project to completion, including to the residents and homeowners who remained patient throughout the construction and some who even brought treats to the contractors, to Engineer Lee Gallentine for his extra efforts to help get the \$500,000.00 in grant funds awarded, to the contractors who worked to provide the very best finished product for the residents of Parkersburg, and to city staff and the elected officials who supported the project from the beginning to the end.
