City of Parkersburg • Ordinance No. 391 Adoption

PUBLIC NOTICE

The following ordinance was adopted at the special Parkersburg City Council meeting held January 15, 2026. Ordinance No. 391.

An Ordinance Deleting Property from the Tax Increment Financing District for the Parkersburg Urban Renewal Area of the City of Parkersburg, Iowa, Pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Parkersburg, Iowa (the "City") previously enacted certain

ordinances providing for the division of taxes levied on taxable property in the Parkersburg Urban Renewal Area pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said ordinances, a portion of the Parkersburg Urban Renewal Area in the City of Parkersburg was designated a "tax increment district"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to decrease the size of the "tax increment district" by deleting certain property;

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Parkersburg, Iowa:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to delete certain property from the tax increment financing district for the Parkersburg Urban Renewal Area.

Section 2. Definitions. For use within this ordinance the following terms shall have the following meanings: "Deleted Property" shall mean certain real property situated in the City of Parkersburg, Butler County, State of Iowa more particularly described

as follows:

LOT 2 OF LYNX ADDITION LOCATED IN PARCEL "I" OF OUTLOT "A", LEGEND TRAIL DEVELOPMENT TO THE CITY OF PARKERSBURG, BUTLER COUNTY, IOWA

Section 3. The Deleted Property is hereby removed from the tax increment financing district for the Parkersburg Urban Renewal Area. No division of property tax revenues as provided under Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa shall be done

with respect to the Deleted Property without further action by the City Council.

Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Saving Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not

adjudged invalid or unconstitutional. Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The following ordinance was adopted at the regularly scheduled Parkersburg City Council

Meeting held January 5, 2026. Ordinance No. 390.

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Parkersburg, Iowa: SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 165.34 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Parkersburg, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

34. HOME OCCUPATION AND HOME INDUSTRY PERMIT PROCESS.

1. An initial application for a home occupation or home industry permit shall be completed by the property

owner and presented to the City staff for review and consideration. The staff shall also charge an initial non-refundable fee, per Section 165.61(5) of this chapter, which is to be collected with the completed application. When reviewing the application, the City staff shall consider the provisions of this chapter as well as the effect of the proposed home occupation or home industry upon the character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, public utility infrastructure, and other matters pertaining to the general welfare of the City. The staff shall make a formal recommendation to the Board of Adjustment regarding the application.

2. The Board of Adjustment will

then hold a public hearing, notice of which shall be published in a newspaper with general circulation, not less than four days, but not more than 20 days, before rendering a decision on the application. Surrounding property owners (within 200 feet) will also be mailed a copy of the public hearing notice prior to the hearing as a courtesy. If approved by the Board of Adjustment, a home occupation or home industry permit will be valid for one year, or until the home occupation or home industry ceases, or the property changes ownership, or until it is revoked by the Board of Adjustment after a public hearing.

3. Approved home occupation and

home industry permits shall be renewed annually by the Board of Adjustment. The Zoning Administrator shall manage the renewal process, which will commence on July 1 of each year and end on June 30 of each year. The Zoning Administrator shall also charge an annual non-refundable fee, per Section 165.61(6) of this chapter, for each renewed home occupation and home industry permit.

4. Because operating a home occupation or home industry is a privilege, a previously approved application may be revoked by the Board of Adjustment upon substantiated complaint of the surrounding neighborhood, or upon violation of this

chapter, or other provisions of this Code of Ordinances. Prior to considering revocation of an existing permit, the Board of Adjustment shall hold an additional public hearing, according to the standards established in subsection 2 of this section.

5. If an initial permit application is denied by the Board of Adjustment, or a previously approved permit is revoked by the Board of Adjustment, a property owner must wait for a period of one year before reapplying for a home occupation or home industry permit.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision, or part of these ordinances shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional,

such adjudication shall not affect the validity of each of the ordinances as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE. These ordinances shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

Increment Financing District for the Parkersburg Urban Renewal Area of the City of Parkersburg, Iowa, Pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa. Upon roll call vote, all ayes.

There was a motion by Manifold, seconded by Cuvelier to adopt Resolution 1187 setting the date for a public hearing on the designation of the 2026 Parkersburg Housing Urban Renewal Area and on Urban Renewal Plan and Project for February 18, 2026 at 5:00 pm at Parkersburg City Hall. Upon vote, all ayes.

Mayor Timmer and the Council discussed current and future construction projects, their budget(s), and expected completion dates and

challenges. Information on the locations, types, grants awarded, and funds spent on previous projects was provided as well for review. Councilman Madsen left the meeting in progress at 6:45 pm.
