Meeting called to order at 9:00 A.M. by Chairman Rusty Eddy with members Wayne Dralle and Greg Barnett present. Moved by Barnett, second by Dralle to approve the agenda. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motioned by Dralle, second by Barnett to approve the December 16th minutes. All ayes. Motion carried.

No public comment was received. Board considered the Compensation Board's FY27 recommendations which includes Supervisors, Treasurer, Recorder, Auditor and County Attorney 3.14% increase: Sheriff – 5% increase. Motioned by Barnett, second by Dralle to direct Department Heads to initially use those recommendations during

FY27 budgeting. All ayes. Motion carried.

Auditor, County Attorney and Clerk of Court shared concerns regarding the use of the Clerk of Court counter space for County Attorney office situations. County Auditor explained a solution was already remedied to provide additional counter space and Ring camera in the public area for the County Attorney's office.

County Engineer, John Riherd, shared the FY26 BUILD Grant Notice of Funding Opportunity Application is now available for the Packard Bridge. He explained previously stated projects of merit would not be considered this time. They plan to move forward with a third application and utilize a grant writer again.

During the Engineer's update Riherd shared the bridge crew is back working on the Jay Ave bridge so it can reopen. He explained employee feedback received regarding the

employee handbook and the possibility of using an advisory board from the Secondary Roads crews for handbook updates.
