MINUTES AND PROCEEDINGS OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HELD ON MARCH 1, 2022.

Meeting called to order at 9:00 A.M. by Chairman Rusty Eddy with members Tom Heidenwirth and Greg Barnett present. Moved by Barnett, second by Heidenwirth to approve the agenda. All ayes. Motion carried.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read. Motioned by Heidenwirth, second by Barnett to approve the minutes as read. All ayes. Motion carried.

During Public Comment, Supervisor Heidenwirth commented on the status of the Butler County Resource building as he met with Pathways recently. He indicated that they understood the County's stance of going through the auction process to sell the building. Heidenwirth also questioned what the space in the courthouse basement would be used for after Public Health moves to their new building. Auditor, Leslie Groen, stated that we have a lack of space for storage and that space would more than likely be dedicated to storage.

Barnett motioned to open a Public Hearing for the FY23 Proposed Property Tax Levy, second by Heidenwirth. All Ayes. Motion carried. Heidenwirth made a motion to close the public hearing, second by Barnett. All ayes. Motion carried.

The board reviewed Resolution 1023 - Approval of FY23 Maximum Property Tax Dollars. Motioned by Heidenwirth to approve Resolution 1023, second by Barnett. All ayes. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #1023 APPROVAL OF FY23 MAXIMUM PROPERTY TAX DOLLARS

WHEREAS, the Butler County Board of Supervisors have considered the proposed FY23 county maximum property tax dollars for both General County Services and Rural County Services, and WHEREAS, a notice concerning the proposed county maximum property tax dollars was published as required and posted on county website, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing concerning the proposed county maximum property tax dollars was held on March 1, 2022,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Butler County that the maximum property tax dollars for

General County Services and Rural County Services for FY23 shall not exceed the following:

General County Services \$4,781,874

Rural County Services \$2,708,668
The Maximum Property Tax dollars requested in either General County Services or Rural County Services for FY23 represents an increase of 102% from the Maximum Property Tax dollars requested for FY22.

A Date and Time for FY23 Proposed Budget Public Hearing was set for 9:00 A.M. on March 22, 2022.

A townhall meeting has been set for 6:00 P.M. on March 14, 2022 in the EOC basement room of the courthouse to discuss EMS Essential Services. Barnett made it clear that the meeting was to go over the process of getting an EMS Essential Service. He stated that the board of Supervisors is not forcing this on the citizens, and it will ultimately be the choice of the citizens on whether this comes to fruition or not. Chairman Eddy commented that this is a great opportunity for people to come in and discuss the project. Details of the project will not be available as the project is only in the infant stages. The purpose of this meeting will be to generate ideas and speak through the process with citizens.

Barnett mentioned that the county website will be updated with information regarding the EMS essential services discussion soon, so that citizens will be able to stay abreast of the process while alleviating confusion that comes by way of rumors. Motioned by Barnett, second by Heidenwirth to approve claims. All ayes. Motion carried.

MINUTES City of Aplington

REGULAR MEETING OF THE APLINGTON CITY COUNCIL APLINGTON CITY HALL MARCH 9, 2022 6:00 P.M.

The Aplington City Council met in regular session on March 9, 2022. Jason Mehmen, Mayor, called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council members present: Schipper, Meyer, Uhlenhopp, Lage, and Jacobs.

A motion by Jacobs, seconded by Lage, to approve the consent agenda, which includes the agenda, the financial report ending February 2022, and a list of claims as presented, carried unanimously.

Jeff Ridder, reported to the Council that the City is required to file an annual reliability plan with the Iowa Utilities Board by April 1. A motion was made by Lage and seconded by Uhlenhopp, to approve Resolution No. 515-22, adopting and approving an inspection and maintenance plan, scheduling inspection and maintenance, carried unanimously.

Notes from the pool meeting were distributed to the Council. Jordan Simon gave a report on different options and asked for participation at the next meeting to be held March 31, at 7 pm at City Hall.

Chief Matt Lind discussed the possibility of increasing the parking fines from \$5 to \$25. An amendment to the Ordinance will be proposed.

Alexis Karsjens, Library Director, reported that they are offering at STEM/Science take & make for students to come in during spring break.

Fire Department members were on hand asking the City to consider purchasing 2.37A of land in Sec 28 ;T90 R17 (west part of 181138 Highway 57). A tentative offer to the City was brought to the table. Also discussed was a lease to own or USDA financing. The City will need to have Speer Financial advise as to our bonding capacity. A proposed meeting will be set up with the City, Fire Department, Speer Financial, and possibly INRCOG.

The Council also discussed another property for possible City buildings.

A motion by Meyer, seconded by Jacobs, to hold a public hearing for the sale of land on Wednesday, March 23, at 6 pm, carried unani-

mously.

A motion was made by Meyer and seconded by Schipper, to approve the 2nd reading and waive the 3rd reading of Ordinance No. 215-22 adding Chapter 56 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Aplington. Roll call vote: Ayes: Lage, Schipper, Uhlenhopp, and Meyer. Nays: Jacobs. Ordinance no. 215-22 was approved.

Mayor Mehmen opened the public hearing for the proposed Fiscal year budget 22-23. There being no comments, the hearing was closed. A motion by Lage, seconded by Meyer, to approve Resolution No. 514-22 adopting the Fiscal year 22-23 budget, carried with a roll call vote of all ayes.

Greg Nevenhoven, LSB insurance, updated the Council on the City's insurance renewal plan. Total premium had an increase of \$4200.

The Council discussed additional land for the Pleasant View Cemetery. The clerk was instructed to call to have the south portion of the cemetery surveyed.

An estimate was discussed on a new door to City Hall. The Council asked for a couple more quotes.

There being no further business, a motion by Jacobs, seconded by Lage, to adjourn, carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 7:33 p.m.

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MINUTES City of Parkersburg

CITY OF PARKERSBURG MARCH 7, 2022 PARKERSBURG, IOWA

The City Council of the City of Parkersburg, Iowa met in regular session on Monday, March 7, 2022 at 7:00 P.M. at the Parkersburg Fire Station due to flooding and water damages that occurred at the Parkersburg Civic Center. Council members present: Abkes, Bruns, Cuvelier, Goodrich, and Johnson.

Mayor Mike Timmer called the meeting to order and led those in attendance in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

There was a motion by Johnson, seconded by Bruns to approve the minutes. Upon vote, all ayes.

There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Cuvelier to approve the bills. Upon vote, all ayes.

Hunter Maitland informed Mayor Timmer and the City Council that the water meters and radio heads the city currently uses are being discontinued and are no longer available. He stated a meeting is scheduled to discuss options to consider in the future as well as pricing. There was also discussion to consider the Water Plant repairs and quote presented prior. There was a motion by Goodrich, seconded by Johnson to approve the quote with A1A Sandblasting Iowa for \$46,000.00 to include: sandblasting and painting two to three coats of epoxy all of the piping and tanks in the water plant, covering and protecting the electronic equipment and power boards, grinding, cleaning, and applying a minimum of three coats of epoxy floor covering. Upon vote: Ayes: Bruns, Cuvelier, Goodrich, and Johnson. Nays: Abkes. Motion carried.

Rod Luhring spoke about locating a water main break near the intersection of 4th Street and Wemple Street that is scheduled to be fixed. There was discussion about informing the public as best as possible if service was going to be shut off to residents during the repairs. Rod stated that the city plans on posting a map of the area affected on Facebook and updates will be posted so residents know when services could be expected to be shut off.

Butler County Emergency Management Director Chris Showalter provided an update on recent bylaw changes within his department. He also spoke about upgrades being done to the county radio and dispatch systems and stated that new radios were recently ordered for the ambulance departments in the county using 911 funds available. Mayor Timmer asked about the county considering hiring ambulance staff members to assist local ambulance crews in the county. Director Showalter explained that a Town Hall meeting is scheduled in Allison at the Courthouse on March 14, 2022 at 6:00 pm to begin the discussion with the public about the topic. He reiterated that the Butler County Supervisors are thankful for everyone who currently volunteers to provide emergency medical services in Butler County. Chris also reminded everyone that the current staffing shortages and problems are not just a Butler County problem, they also exist state-wide and beyond.

There was a motion by Goodrich, seconded by Abkes to approve the liquor license renewal for Brothers Market subject to ABD approval. Upon vote, all ayes.

There was a motion by Goodrich, seconded by Cuvelier to adopt Resolution 1074 approving the 28E Joint Public Service Agreement with Butler County for the purpose of upgrading Orchid Lane. Upon vote, all ayes.

Chris Luhring provided information and a map provided by Dumont Telephone Company regarding the expansion of their broadband internet service area. This expansion area generally includes the residents who live north of Wemple Street and east of 2nd Street.

Information was presented regarding a proposed new subdivision and annexation request anticipated to be filed with the city in the near future.

There was a motion by Johnson, seconded by Cuvelier to adopt Resolution 1075 amending the Butler County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan to include future hazard mitigation actions to the Parkersburg section. Upon vote, all ayes.

There was a motion by Cuvelier, seconded by Bruns to adopt Resolution 1076 approving the local match for the FEMA Hazard Mitigation Assistance Program Application. Upon vote, all ayes.

Mayor Timmer and the City Council discussed the fiscal year 2023 budget. Councilman Cuvelier spoke about his experience on the A-P School Board and the importance of elected officials taking into consideration the large increase in taxable valuations of property in Parkersburg when they approve their budgets. Chris Luhring provided information about the increased amounts of tax dollars asked for

over time by Butler County, the Aplington-Parkersburg School District, and the city. There was discussion about the best ways of communicating our concerns to the other taxing entities in order to lessen the overall tax burden on residents and to be able to encourage growth in the area. There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Cuvelier to set the date of public hearing to adopt the fiscal year 2023 budget and to approve the certification of taxes for Monday, March 28, 2022 at 5:00 pm at Parkersburg City Hall. Upon vote, all ayes.

Chris Luhring stated that there is no legal method of providing water and/or sewer utilities to All-Play Ball Park / Diamonds and Fields at no charge, even though the services they provide to the community and area are 100% "public purpose". Chris did state he found out there are other legal methods of providing support to All-Play Ball Park if the City Council chooses to do so in the future. There were no objections with moving forward with researching those options.

Julie Folken provided an update on the library and the calendar of events, including the wide variety of programming scheduled to be taking place this spring and summer. Julie also stated that she has been working with the Aplington Library as well to provide programming and even more resources to the public.
