Parkersburg, Iowa The City Council of the City of Parkersburg, Iowa met in special session on Monday, April 7, 2025 at 6:00 P.M. at the Parkersburg City Hall. Council members present: Cuvelier, Madsen, Manifold, Schneiderman, and Simon.

Mayor Mike Timmer called the meeting to order and led those in attendance in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Timmer opened the public hearing on the proposed fiscal year 2026 property tax rate. There was discussion about the proposed adoption of the budget and certification of city taxes. Debt service expendictures were reviewed, as well as total expenses and revenues. There was discussion about the property tax notices that were mailed to every property owner in late March. The City Administrator stated that the intent of the notice is to accurately show property owners what each parcel of their property is worth and the exact amount of the property taxes being paid by parcel to the individual taxing authorities. He explained that the notices do not accomplish this intent at all unfortunately. There was discussion about the proposed library budget and the increase in hours the library is now open. There was also discussion about the police budget.

Upon no further discussion, Mayor Timmer closed the public hearing on the fiscal year 2026 budget.

Work under this project consists of approximately 947 square yards of PCC pavement with subbase; approximately 133 feet of PCC curb and gutter; 115 feet of retaining wall; removals; grading; along with appurtenant work. All bids must be filed on or before the Noon deadline previously stated. All bids shall be made on forms furnished by the City and must be enclosed in a separate sealed envelope and plainly identified. In addition, the bond shall guarantee against defects in materials or workmanship for a period of two years after completion and acceptance by the City.

By virtue of statutory authority, preference will be given to products and provisions grown and coal produced within the State of Iowa and to Iowa domestic labor to the extent lawfully required under lowa statues.

Payments will be made to the Contractor based on monthly estimates in amounts equal to ninety-five percent (95%) of the contract value of the work completed, excluding materials and equipment delivered to the job site during the preceding calendar month, and will be based upon an estimate prepared on the twenty-fifth (25th) day of each month by the Contractor, subject to the approval of the Engineer. Such monthly payment will in no way be construed as an act of acceptance for any part of the work partially or totally completed. update of the police department and equipment needed. He requested funding to approve the purchase of radios for both squad cars, estimated to be \$4,034.50 for each radio. There was a motion by Schneiderman, seconded by Cuvelier to approve the purchase of equipment. Upon vote, all aves. There was a motion by Cuvelier,

seconded by Simon to recognize Jen Nichols as a new member to the Parkersburg Ambulance Service. Upon vote, all ayes.

Librarian Julie Folken provided information about the programming offered during spring break, including a new STEM program held. She stated the library is now open an additional two hours per week. Julie also expressed her appreciation for the community support including both volunteer support and continued donations to pay for programming and other library needs.

Engineer Lee Gallentine provided an update of current and upcoming capital projects. Lee stated that Hudson Hardware will be starting construction on the Newell Avenue Reconstruction Project in the next week or two. Lee also stated that the Wemple Street Watermain Reconstruction Project can now be put out for bids according to the grant requirements. There was a motion by Simon, seconded by Cuvelier to set the date of public hearing to form a contract, consider the Engineer's estimate, and to consider the plans and specifications for the Wemple Street Watermain Replacement Project for April 28, 2025 at 7:30 pm.
