will be taking place this week.

The Aplington City Council met in regular session on July 9, 2025. Mayor Mehmen, called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council members present: Jacobs, Noble, Klahsen and Wolff. Absent: Lage

A motion by Klahsen, seconded by Jacobs, to approve the consent agenda, which includes the agenda, minutes of the June 18, 2025 meeting, financial report ending June 2025, and a list of claims for approval, carried unanimously.

Public Works Department: Mike Meyer spoke about the need to fill in or cover the pool to prevent it from filling with rain water. This would also negate the need to pay for insurance on the open pool. After some discussion, the subject was tabled until more information was available for options. Current driveway conditions were discussed for Brandon Stohr and Shason Kramer.

The Council gave both parties a deadline of October 17, 2025 to cement their driveways. The Council discussed the missing siding on Kanne Woodley's addition. After talking with Kanne, the project is to be complete no later than November 1, 2025.

Building Permits for Tom Lindaman and Daryl Folken were approved.

Police Department: Chief Matt Lind spoke of the need for replacing one garage door, repairing the track on one door, and installing garage door openers on both doors at the Police Garage. A motion by Jacobs, seconded by Klahsen, passed unanimously. Chief Lind also spoke of fines for nuisances. After some discussion, the subject was tabled again for next month.

Library: Alexis Karsjens reported that the Summer Program is half over and they have had 500 kids. The library will be open on July 24th from 5am – 3pm for RAGBRAI.

The Council discussed not renewing 2 CDs held at LSB and moving the funds from those CDs to IPAIT at a higher interest rate. A motion by Klahsen, seconded by Noble, carried unanimously.
