Superintendent's Report:

- Instructional Updates:
  - August 19th - New Teacher Workshop
  - August 20th - All district meeting
  - Kaleidoscope Update letters have been sent to families.
- Financial Updates:
  - Insurance company EMC has been contacted with a request for a board presentation on insurance coverage.
  - AP District Instructional Support Levy expires at the end of FY26, Language is being drafted for December/January board approval.
  - AP will receive a one time funding amount to be applied to hourly staff. Plans for applying the funds are being finalized.

- Facility and Planning Updates:
  - Master Facility Planning petitions are being presented tonight, as well as the resolution calling for an election.
  - A purchase agreement for property near the high school has been drawn up for board action tonight.
  - The district has been contacted by the city about a proposed bike trail that would cut through the far north edge of the school's property near the baseball field. Language and options will be drawn up and brought back to the board for approval.
  - Aplington asphalt project near the school is complete
  - Banners in front of the high school have updated
  - The Historical Home bell has been taken down and relocated to the high school until future display plans are decided.
