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Butler County Auditor and Commissioner of Elections, Leslie Groen, hereby gives Public Notice to the qualified voters of Butler County, Iowa, that a Primary Election will be held on June 7, 2022. 7-PB: Albion Township lying South of 305th Street; West of Ridge Ave to the intersection of 290th, and also West of Quail Avenue (All Albion excluding Sections 1, 2, 11, 12, N 1/2 of 13), including the City of Parkersburg.

8-NH That part of Beaver Township lying South of 310th Street and South of 305th Street, including the City of New Hartford.

Any voter who requires assistance to vote by reason of blindness, disability, or inability to read or write may be given assistance at the polls by a person of the voter's choice, other than the voter's employer or agent of that employer, or officer or agent of the voter's union.

Any voter who is physically unable to enter a polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle.

Voter ID: All voters will be asked to show their ID before voting at the polls, including voters who are already registered in the correct precinct, voters who move within the county to a new precinct, and voters who are not yet registered to vote in the county. Visit https://voterready-iowa.org/resources for information regarding valid voter identification and proof of residency.

Absentee Voting
Absentee ballots are available in the Auditor's Office, where Butler County voters may vote absentee in person through 5:00 p.m. on Monday, June 6th. Iowa ID required.

To vote by mail, the Auditor's Office must receive a written request for a ballot using one of the following methods:

An official form can be found at https://butlercounty.iowa.gov/

On paper no smaller than 3" x 5"

Voters may also submit a request for an absentee ballot by email or fax if it contains an original signature. Original such requests must also be mailed to the Auditor with a postmark date no later than the pre-registration deadline for the election for which the ballot was requested (May 23rd, 2022 for the Primary Election).

All requests must include the voter's name, birthdate, residence address, mailing address if different, name or date of election, along with the following new required information: Iowa Driver's License number or Nonoperator Iowa ID number, or if you do not have an Iowa ID then you must use the IVoter issued PIN number. Please call the Auditor's Office at 319-267-2670 for help in

finding your Voter PIN number if you do not have or cannot find your Iowa ID. For Primary Elections only: include your political party affiliation (Democratic or Republican ballot for this election).

Deadlines for this election:
Last day to pre-register and or request that an absentee ballot be mailed is 5:00 p.m. Friday, May 23rd.

Last day to vote an Absentee Ballot in person is 5:00 p.m. Monday, June 6th.

A voted absentee ballot to be mailed back to the Auditor must be postmarked no later than the day before Election Day.

A voter's absentee ballot may NOT be turned in to the polling place for counting, however the voter or the voter's designee may turn the ballot in to the Auditor by the time the close on Election Day.



NEW HARTFORD CITY COUNCIL MINUTES
May 4, 2022

ROLL CALL: Mayor Dennis Canfield, Tim Woods, Abbie Perez, Barb Harper, Randy Johnson, Cindy Brewer

OTHERS PRESENT:

Mayor starts the meeting at 5:30p with the Pledge of Allegiance then asking for consideration of agenda: agenda approval was moved by Harper 2nd by Johnson with vote being all ayes motion carries.

Motion to open Budget Amendment FY22 Public Hearing was moved by Brewer 2nd by Perez with roll call vote being Ayes Johnson, Harper, Perez, Brewer, Woods Nays 0 Motion Carries.

Mayor announces this public hearing is for the purpose to amend the FYE 2022 budget. A quorum was present. Notice of time and place of the hearing had been published on April 20th in the Eclipse-News-Review and the affidavit of publication was available. The amendment was considered and taxpayers and citizens heard for and against said budget amendment. No written or oral objections received. After giving opportunity for all desiring to be heard, Woods made a motion to close public hearing 2nd by Perez with roll call vote being Ayes Johnson, Harper, Perez, Brewer, Woods Nays 0 Motion Carries.

Woods moved to adopt RESOLUTION #782AF2022 APPROVAL OF BUDGET AMENDMENT FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2022 second by Brewer with roll call vote being Johnson, Harper, Perez, Brewer, Woods Nays 0 Motion Carries. Mayor Canfield declares the Resolution #782AF2022 is duly adopted.

Clerk gave a brief Splash Pad update explaining the ribbon cutting ceremony May 15th inviting all to attend. She also talked about putting a fence up on the south side of the parking lot to prevent people from driving onto the grass and requested the little league field be prepared prior to the 14th as that will be the 1st game on the field for the season.

Motion to approve Consent Agenda as presented was moved by Woods 2nd by Brewer with the vote being all ayes motion carries.

Building permits brought up a discussion of 1208 York St Flood Plain Permit compliance and the renewal of the 809 Water St deck building permit. Motion made by Johnson 2nd by Perez to deny renewal for 809 Water St as the outside of the house needs to be completed prior to additional consideration with vote being 4 ayes absent Woods motion carries.

Clerk explains a late fence building permit application was turned in for 1229 Main St which will be on the next agenda for consideration and asked if any questions or concerns from council for this application which yelled no concerns.

Maintenance opened comments with explanation of two trees that need to be torn down in the park prior to splash pad construction as they will become a nuisance. Johnson wants to make sure all future bids state rates if city helps; Johnson discusses the lawnmowers and explains he has taken one of the older mowers home to evaluate its condition. Johnson discussed having the mower used as a trade in or sealed bid as it does not get used enough for city to keep.; Maintenance also discusses hiring Municipal Pipe to clean out the storm drains on Main St as they are plugged.

Motion to purchase John Deere Z930M ZTrak as quoted from P & K in the amount of \$10,400 with the option of trade in moved by Harper 2nd by Woods with vote being all ayes motion carries.

Motion to hire Municipal Pipe to clean out the storm drains not to exceed eight hours or \$2000 moved by Johnson 2nd by Brewer with vote being all ayes motion carries.

Parking updates were briefly discussed and will be put on the next month's agenda for ordinance changes.

City requested Sheriff's Dept deliver nuisance notice to 101 Saratoga St; and another group of property nuisance invitations to meet with City Council at council meeting were sent out with no response received moving these nuisance properties to the next category.

Motion made by Brewer 2nd by Perez to set city-wide cleanup day July 9th starting at 8a til 3p at the Lion's Club Parking lot on Broadway St. Maintenance Department will switch a day during the week of the 5th of their choosing for working on Saturday the 9th with the vote being ayes 4 with Woods absent motion carries.

Motion made by Perez to close Water St from Park St to East St and Main St from Broadway St to East St for Beaver Creek Days June 4th second by Harper with vote being ayes 4 absent Woods motion carries.

Mayor Canfield explained he's been spending time with Maintenance Dept including a ride along for weekly testing.

In light of receiving complaints of dogs running at large, clerk will look into registering pets.

Johnson explained they put gravel along the parking north of Wood Park; Perez was questioning the potholes at Casey's and requested an update on the Tree grant and leaf burning ordinance.

Motion to adjourn moved by Brewer 2nd by Perez with votes being Ayes 4 absent Woods Motion Carries.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read. Motioned by Barnett, second by Eddy to approve the minutes as read. All ayes. Motion carried.

No Public Comment was received.

Elections Deputy, Matt Wilken, shared updates for the upcoming Primary Election on June 7, 2022. Voters are reminded that due to drawing new precinct lines, some voters will have changes in their polling places. A card will be sent out to those individuals who are affected before the Primary Election, and again before the General Election. A precinct map can be found on the Butler County website. The Aplington City Council met in regular session on May 11, 2022. Jason Mehmen, Mayor, called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Council members present: Schipper, Meyer, Uhlenhopp, Lage, and Jacobs.

Frances Krull, Aplington Ambulance Chief, reported on the number of calls during the month. Will McCord, department member, is the spokesperson for the proposed county EMS.

The tornado siren is working and can be set off at various locations. It still is unable to be set off by the County.

A brief discussion was held as to selling a portion of the City property where the old water tower is located.
